Course Instructions:

3. We will cover these materials in order, although some Problems assigned may take more than one class to complete;
4. In that regard, if this Syllabus lists Notes in a certain order, I would prefer you read them in that order. If a Note is not mentioned, read that note generally.

Special Note Regarding Examination Materials

5. Each student will be expected to contribute to the possible examination in this course. By the end of the class following completion of the material, each student in the class shall turn in the following:
 - a. 4 Multiple Choice Questions based on readings from the *Syllabus*. If your last name begins with the letters A-G, your questions will be directed towards Chapters I and II, and will be due the Thursday following completion of this material; if your last name begins with H-O, you questions will be directed towards Chapters III and IV, and will be due the Thursday following completion of this material; and if your last name begins with P-Z, your questions will be directed towards Chapters V and VI and will be due the last Thursday of class of the semester. You may turn questions in early by attaching them to an email to me.
 - b. Multiple Choice Questions shall be typed, shall contain at least 4 distracting answers and 1 correct answer. On a separate sheet of paper, you **MUST** indicate why the distractors are wrong and why the correct answer is correct;
 - c. Your Multiple Choice Questions shall have your name affixed to them;
 - d. I will not guarantee that I will use any of the questions submitted.

Ethics In Action Assignment

6. In addition to the examination preparation materials, and the final examination, each student **MUST** complete the following Ethics in Action Assignment: Each year, students comment that the rules we study do not match up with the reality of what they have been doing or have seen done in their firm. It would be impermissible for students to share firm confidences, but it is important that we share “ethics experiences.” Consequently, I will distribute an email list of all students in the class. Each student must post **two observations** about the “ethics” of something that

happens on either “The Practice” or one of the versions of “Law and Order,” television shows that attempt to show the law as real life drama. Your postings must make reference to an event in one of the shows, explain enough facts to make the event understood and then analyze those facts in light of the Model Rules of Professional Conduct. Any other student may, but is not required to comment on an earlier posting. A comment to an earlier posting can also qualify as fulfilling this assignment if it also analyzes facts in light of a specified rule or rules. Ethics in Action Assignment One is due not later than the completion of Chapter 3 of the text. Ethics in Action Assignment Two is due not later than the completion of Chapter 5 of the text.
